Welcome to Physics I course.



### 1) **Information.**

### 2) **Homework.**

You will need to register at *Mastering Physics (MP)* to do your online HWs. HWs will be due on Sunday midnight.

You have to register to MP through your BB. Go to BB and find Physics I course. Then, go to MP folder, click on any of the links and follow guidance.

(MP Course name: *PHYS1410Fall2019*)

### 3) **Clickers.**

We will be using Turning Technologies (TT) clickers during the semester. So you will need these regular for our University clickers

<http://clickers.wiki.uml.edu/>. Both clickers, big or small, will work for us.

Before each lecture, you have to “tune” your clicker to my channel, which is 61 (Press a button “Channel” or “Ch” and type 61)



#### **How to register your clickers:**

- 1) Go to your BB
- 2) On the “front page” of the course *PHYS 1410 P 1 202 Physics I Fall 2019* click “*Lowell Day Turning Account Registration*” and it will guide you through the registration procedure. You will need to know your clicker number (see the back of your clicker) and a license number.

#### **There are three option of getting your clicker:**

- You can buy them at the University bookstore (a license number will be attached).
- If you borrow a used clicker from somebody, you will have to purchase a license number directly from TT during your clicker registration procedure.
- There is an option of using a free TT app “ResponseWare”, but you still have to purchase a license number directly from TT during your clicker registration procedure.
